A worldwide recognized leader in helping companies and communities profit from more sustainable practices, Hunter Lovins has authored and co-authored numerous books, including *Brittle Power* (1982), *Energy Unbound* (1986), *Factor Four—Doubling Wealth, Halving Resource Use* (1997), *Green Development* (1998), *Natural Capitalism* (1999), and hundreds of papers and articles. She was named as a Time magazine “Hero for the Planet” in 2000, and a Newsweek “Green Business Icon” in 2008.

Hunter has consulted for governments and the private sector, briefing senior management at such groups as Interface, Mitsubishi, Bank of America, Royal Dutch/Shell Group, and numerous utility companies.
